The Summer of 2025 TUF Work

SITUATION

The City of Newberg is committed to five times more TUF funded road improvement projects than the summer effort of 2024. In total, approximately \$420,000 will be spent in the second half of FY 24 – 25. This provides a wide margin because the TUF reserve has \$1.3 million available after the \$583,000 that was spent last year on 2nd street, parking lots, etc.

For the first half of BY 25-27, \$920,000 is currently budgeted to be spent. This will include \$300,000 of materials (cement crack seal, thermo-plastic, etc.) to get ready for 2026 ADA work and post-TUF work.

This work will pave the way for a massive follow-up slurry seal project on Mountainview and a small amount of grind and inlay on the next southern target in 2026.

In the second half of the Biennium, there will therefore be at least \$1.6 million in reserve for the next wave of projects in the summer of 2026 and the first half of 2027, as it should be.

The relevant GL: 18-5150-703000 is city-wide pavement preservation.

MISSION

During four discrete phases of activity, the city will improve the surface of the following roads:

Note that Mountainview will be ongoing whenever the weather is decent.


EXECUTION PHASE 1 – Mountainview Crack Seal

To combat a series of linear cracks running parallel to the curb and to prepare the road surface for slurry seal in 2026, the city will use a combination of our own staff and hired day labor to fill the cracks in Mountainview with a crack-filling machine and previously purchased filler. This will utilize an East to West approach to deconflict as much as possible with the Collina Crossing housing development. Road flaggers will be used as much as possible to avoid Mountainview closures and minimize the impact to A-Dec, as well as Allison Hotel staff and guests.

While work will be initiated in May, after crack sealing training on the new equipment, it will proceed in phases. Small sections of Mountainview will need to be closed to facilitate the repairs. This will only occur in the sections adjacent to N College Street.

At the start of May, the Capital Engineering team and Admin team will leaflet the subdivisions adjacent to the street to inform them of the coming roadwork and to avoid any on-street parking [See Handout A]. As usual, TVF&R and Waste Management will be informed. Additionally, the team will conduct outreach to A-Dec management for their awareness.

The work will broadly run east to west and avoid construction areas.

In order for car leaflets with tow-away messages to be distributed effectively, PW maintenance will give the CM / Admin team a week's notice before each section. The sections have been numbered 1 through 5. [See Mountainview detailed plan developed with Carl and Adam in April].

EXECUTION PHASE 2 – Southern district Grind and Inlay


In the second week of June, Eagle Elsner will perform grind and inlay repairs on several southern streets, including:

- A small section of E 4th Street.
- S Center Street (long section 3rd to 9th).
- Small S. Meridian section last.

The work is anticipated to run from North to South.

The Administration and Capital Engineering staff will conduct leafleting of all impacted households and cars in the first week of June [See handouts B.1 - B.3]. Residents will be asked to place their trash cans on the side streets rather than the frontage street for the week in question and informed that they should label them with a Sharpie with their home address.

As usual, TVF&R and Waste Management will be informed. This is the RED work below:



EXECUTION PHASE 3 – Fulton Street & Meadow Grind and Inlay

In the second week of July, Eagle Elsner will perform grind and inlay repairs on two northern street sections, including:

- Fulton Street
- Meadow Lane


Fulton Street will be closed with section A completed first, followed by section B, as to allow ambulance access at all times, see map below.

The Administration and Capital Engineering staff will conduct leafleting of all impacted households and cars in the first week of July [See handout C].

Considerable outreach will occur with respect to Friends View, including a town hall style event for residents.

GFU has already assured us that there will be limited activity on campus at this time and no conferences.

As usual, TVF&R and Waste Management will be informed.



EXECUTION PHASE 4 – Southern District Cape and Slurry Seal

Starting August 11th, for one week, Doolittle LLC will perform Slurry and Cape Seal repairs on several southern streets, including:


- S Howard St. Cape Seal
- E Third St, from Howard to College Cape Seal
- S. School St. Cape Seal
- E Third St, from Main to Blaine Slurry seal only

The Administration and Capital Engineering staff will conduct leafleting of all impacted households and cars in the first week of August [See handout D.1 – D.3].

Residents will be asked to place their trash cans on the side streets rather than the frontage street for the week in question, and informed that they should label them with a Sharpie with their home address.

As usual, TVF&R and Waste Management will be informed.

Cape Seal is the **BLUE**, and slurry seal is the **ORANGE** work below:



ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS

The Administration and Capital Engineering teams will provide backpacks, printing, and painter's tape for these operations.

The Community Engagement Interim PIO will provide digital messaging, and the CM will provide town hall addresses.

The City already has the thermo-plastic, crack-filling material, and the crack-filling machine from earlier TUF purchases.

Seasonal labor purchased with TUF dollars can only be used for TUF-related tasks.

Brian Kershaw and Will Worthey will position the reader boards to inform the public about each phase of these operations.

COMMAND AND CONTROL

Crack sealing operations will be under the supervision of Preston Langeliers and operationally run by Adam Claussen. Crack sealing adjacent to the Collina housing project will be tackled via a "wait and see" or opportunity basis. For this section, Adam will coordinate closely with Brian Kershaw to assess what can be accomplished this summer. Obviously, sections that need to be repaired by Collina will not be crack-sealed.

General coordination will be under the control of the CM. All TUF-related invoices will be entered into and processed for payment by the CM, including those related to the crack sealing operation and its flagging work.

On-site visits and coordination with Dolittle and Eagle Elsner will be coordinated by the Capital Engineering PM, Brian Kershaw. Here is the list of other impacted parties who must receive notices on closures and related driving impacts:
